AN OPEN-SOURCE HERITAGE INVENTORY AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Thursday, November 6th from 14:30 to 17:00

Arches is an open source software system that incorporates international standards and is built to inventory and help manage all types of immovable cultural heritage. The code is freely available to download, customize, and independently implement.

We welcome conference participants who would like to learn about Arches and recent project developments, including an overview of the new functionality that will be available in Arches version 3.0. Other topics that will be covered are:

1. An overview of how Arches manages heritage data, including international data standards, controlled vocabularies, and integration with external services
2. How to use Arches, including creating and managing data, using the layer library, searching and reporting functionality, and an overview of system administration
3. Suggestions for evaluating Arches for use by your organization
4. Deployment scenarios, including possible uses and an overview of what may be involved in installing and configuring the system, data import and export, and potential customization

Members of the Arches Project team will be available to answer questions during and after the information session.
